
TRINITY SUNDAY

June 19, 2011



Although most of our liturgical worship is addressed to the Blessed Trinity, today we are invited to honor the Tri-Personal God in a very special manner. Our limited intelligence is unable to fathom exhaustively this fundamental mystery of one God in three Persons. Nor can our frail hearts adequately reciprocate His love. There is always so much more we should know about the Trinity; so much more we should do for love of Him. The biggest challenge, however, is to reproduce in ourselves and in our relationships the love, harmony, and unity that exist in and among the three Divine Persons. Let this be the special grace we implore for ourselves and all those dear to us as we offer this Eucharist to the Father, through Jesus, the Son, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

As we celebrate Father's Day, let us also pray for all fathers and ask God to bless them.



WAYS TO HONOR THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The simplest way to honor the Most Holy Trinity is to begin every day by making the **Sign of the Cross** with deep faith and devotion, paying special attention to the words that we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!" Then worship the Triune God in your heart by reciting the prayer "**Glory Be . . .**" and **the Creed** through which we renew our faith in the tripersonal God from whom we come, in whom we live, and in whom we will find our eternal happiness.

Then **thank** the Blessed Trinity for all the graces and favors received so far, **ask** for His protection during the day, and **offer** Him all the actions that you will perform and the pains that you will endure. In this way, **all that you are and do will be offered as a "living sacrifice of love" to the God who is our Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier and Source of our happiness.**

These prayers can be repeated during the day, especially the shorter ones as simple acts of love and worship. The Sign of the Cross should be made also before every important action that we do, such as when we begin our daily activity, before and after taking our meals, when we travel, when we feel tempted or in danger. Every day should end in the same way we should begin it. **Our final thought should be an act of entrustment of ourselves and all those who are dear to us to the Most Holy Trinity.**

In addition to honoring the Trinity through our prayers, we should also make every effort **to become in our daily lives a reflection of the "personal loving communion" which the Blessed Trinity is.** We do that by relating with respect, openness, and love to all human beings, and especially the members of our family, colleagues and other people we interact with. It is only by respecting and loving our neighbor that we can say that we respect and love the Blessed Trinity, for He dwells in each human being.

As St. John says, "**One who has no love for the brother he has seen cannot love the God he has not seen**" (1 Jn4:20).



In today's celebration of the Eucharist, some members of our parish are going to make their profession of the gospel life in the Secular Franciscan Order.

While giving thanks to the Father through Christ for all the gifts we have received from him, we have a special reason for gratitude today: the gift of his grace which he has given to those about to be professed to live in the world according to the spirit of the Beatitudes and also the gift of his grace which he has given to the whole community by adding new members to the Secular Franciscan Order. The permanent commitment to the gospel life publicly proclaimed today during this celebration reminds us of something which is also made present every day in the Eucharist. After the example of Christ and in union with his own act of thanksgiving, we are invited to present ourselves before the Father as living sacrifices of praise for the life of the world.



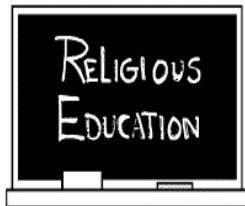
The Catechetical Year 2010-2011 has ended !
