A s we continue praying for all our departed in this month of November, today's theme reminds us of a basic truth of our faith which is also related to our prayer for the dead, namely: **the resurrection of all human beings at the end of time.**

That will be the time when all of us will receive from the Eternal Judge, even in our bodies, the reward or punishment deserved by the way we have lived. Such a truth gives meaning to our efforts to lead an honest life. It also reminds us that our bodies are sacred, and they have to be used not to serve the devil, but for the glory of God. Our faith tells us that, even after our bodies have suffered the disintegration of death, God's creative power will call us back to life in the fullness of our being, for He is "the God of the Living" and not of the dead.

This is what we proclaim in every Eucharistic celebration and why we look with hope to the day of our final resurrection.

The month of November is dedicated to the *Souls in Purgatory*. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1030-32 we read: " All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to

enter the joy of heaven." The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. ...

From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead: Let us help and commemorate them. If Job's sons were purified by their father's sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some consolation? Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."
